She helped advise other Fisher Communications stations by implementing best practice standards and long-term strategies.

In Philadelphia, she was news director at WTXF from 2004-2007 where she overhauled all newscasts, launched new ones and increased ratings. She worked her way up to news director through several other news management roles including assistant news director at WTTG in Washington, D.C.; executive producer at WBAL in Baltimore; and managing editor at KOCO in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Gauntt's family moved to Colorado when she was a child. She stayed in the area to attend the University of Colorado, Boulder where she earned her Bachelor of Science in Broadcast Journalism.

She is a loyal Denver Broncos fan and is very active in the community and the industry. She is on the advisory board for the University of Colorado School of Journalism and is a regional chairperson for Radio, Television, Digital News Association. She is the past president of both ABC News Affiliate Advisory Board and National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences Northwest Chapter.
